Clothing grant at age 11

If your child is transferring from primary to secondary school you may be entitled to receive a clothing grant.

To qualify, you must be a Hackney resident and be getting one of the benefits below:

- Income support
- Income-based jobseeker's allowance
- Child tax credit, and getting no more than £16,190 a year
- Working tax credit, getting no more than £16,190 a year
- Guarantee element of pension credit, or
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Universal Credit with a net earnings threshold of £15,400 a year

Applications should be made before 30 June. The clothing grant is still available for Year 7 pupils who have started secondary school from September 2017 and meet the eligibility criteria above.
