PUPIL PREMIUM

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who:

- are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM)
- are not currently eligible for Free School Meals but have been historically at any time within the last six years;
- have been looked after, via the local authority, continuously for more than six months.

FSM breakdown 2019-20

The school has been awarded funding for 193 pupils (53%) who are on, or have been entitled to FSM in the last 6 years. This is significantly higher than the national average of 24% and is in the highest 20% of schools in the country.

This year St. Dominic's has been awarded **£254,760** and in order to best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils in our school we have allocated our funding as follows:

PUPIL PREMIUM ALLOCATION 2018-19

In the academic year 2018-19, the school had 198 pupils (52%) who were on, or had been entitled to, FSM in the previous six years. St. Dominic's was awarded **£261,360** and in order to best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils in our school we allocated our funding as follows:

Targeted 1 to 1 support for vulnerable pupils	£56,895	<p>KS2 -Combined reading, writing and maths is above NA at the expected standard (St Dominic's 72%/ NA 65%) and in line at the higher standard (St Dominic's 10%/ NA 10%) St Dominic's is above national across reading, writing and maths at the expected standard. At greater depth the school is above national in reading and maths and slightly lower in writing. The gap between PPI and Non PPI has closed in reading, but we still have work to do particularly in writing.</p> <p>Year 1 Phonic Screening –The proportion of pupils reaching the expected standard has remained high with 81% passing the screening check.</p> <p>KS1 – Standards in reading and maths at age expected are slightly higher than NA. At greater depth maths is in line with national but we are slightly lower in reading. PPI pupils are line with Non PPI pupils in reading and writing at expected standard and are 18% higher in maths. Our combined RWM data indicates that the gap between PPI and Non PPI has closed to 3%</p>
Reading support in KS1 and KS2 (DSR and DR)	£15,000	<p>Accelerated reading progress across year 1 in 2018/2019 (KS1 reading data = 76% / NA 75%) DSR programme runs daily in year 1 supported by DRS Lead / Phase Leader</p> <p>Reading data at the end of KS2 indicates the school is 5% above NA at 78% and the gap between PPG and NON PPI pupils in school has closed</p>
Math's intervention - part funded and delivered by specialist teacher	£55,000	<p>Maths intervention programme led by a highly skilled maths teacher runs in year 2 and continued support is offered to those targeted pupils in year 3.</p> <p>In year 2, PPI pupils have achieved higher than Non- PPI pupils by 18% with 85% achieving the expected standard and the gap between PPI and Non PPI has narrowed to 3% at greater depth.</p>

Kick Step	£3,500	Dance specialist increased awareness of movement, improvisation and performance. Increased pupil confidence.
A Space Therapist	£14,500	Pupil wellbeing and mental health supported through art therapy.
Breakfast Club	£8,000	Children provided with a nutritious breakfast and physical activities with the P.E. coaches enabling good concentration levels in lessons.

Literacy Consultant	£14,600	<p>Support for vulnerable groups in year 6 in reading and writing.</p> <p>Reading data at the end of KS2 indicates the school is 5% above NA at 78% and the gap between PPG and NON PPI pupils in school has closed</p> <p>In writing at the end of KS2 the school achieved slightly higher than NA at 79%</p>
Homework Club	£4,000	Targeted pupils achieved expected progress at the end of KS1.

KS1 Targeted Writing Club	£3,000	Targeted writing club supported vulnerable pupils in KS1 to achieve 67% at the expected standard which is in line with Non PPI pupils and 2% below national
Gardening Club	£12,000	Developed interest in global warming, nature, growing from seed, plant life / care of nature and the sheer joy of watching fruit and Vegetables grow!
Speech and Language Therapist	£33,500	<p>The SALT team set and reviewed targets for every intervention that they provided, ensuring that interventions were appropriate and effective. The SALT service made a significant contribution to improvements in self-esteem, and achievements for our pupils.</p> <p>These positive changes are evidenced in case studies. Launchpad, an early intervention programme ran very effectively in EYFS (see in school data).</p>
