Health Update

We have been receiving daily updates from the Department for Education regarding the Coronavirus. The situation is constantly reviewed and action informed by expert science and advice, guided by the Chief Medical

Officer and the Chief Scientific Adviser.

It's important to remember that whilst the Coronavirus is a very serious issue, we should always try not to frighten or alarm children, especially younger ones.

Following practical steps is a very good way to reassure children and keep us all free from infection.

As we have written before, washing hands with hot water more often and for 20 seconds is vital.

Teach children the **catch it, bin it, kill it** strategy for those with coughs and sneezes.
