### Attendance & Punctuality Class of the Week

**School Street at St. Dominic's**  
On Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September St. Dominic's became a School Street as part of Hackney Council's effort to rebuild a greener Hackney post-lockdown. This will help promote

cleaner air, reduce congestion and increase levels of active travel, creating a more pleasant environment for local communities, while helping with social distancing around the school gates.

**Ballance Road, is now a Pedestrian and Cycle Zone between 8:30-9:30am and 3:00-4:00pm.**

The School Street will not operate on weekends or during the school holidays.

Vehicles will be banned from entering the street between these times unless they have been granted an exemption. Access for residents will be maintained for vehicles registered to an address within the zone.

**It is a traffic offence for non-exempt vehicles to enter the School Streets Zone during operational times, and infractions can carry a penalty charge issued by an Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) camera.**

### Jeans for Genes day

On Friday 18<sup>th</sup> September we are asking children and staff to get their jeans on and donate £1 to support children affected by genetic disorders.

There are around 6,000 genetic disorders. It is estimated that one in 25 children are affected by a genetic disorder. 30,000 babies and children are newly diagnosed in the UK each year. Some genetic disorders are apparent at birth while others are diagnosed at different stages throughout childhood, and sometimes into adolescence.

# Year 3

### School dinners for Year 3 children.

Children who have just entered year 3 no longer benefit from the universal free school meal entitlement.

This means that if your child is not eligible for free school meals because you are not receiving certain benefits, then you will need to pay £2.10 per day (£10.50 per week)

If your child is entitled to free school meals, or if you're not sure about their entitlement, you should contact Hackney Learning Trust as soon as possible.

You can apply on line [www.learningtrust.co.uk](http://www.learningtrust.co.uk) - apply for free school meals and receive an instant decision about eligibility.



### Governors Fund

As a Catholic Voluntary Aided School, we are required to contribute 10% towards all costs relating to the maintenance of and improvement to the children's classrooms, all other buildings and the school grounds, including the school gates and fencing to the playground, as well as any IT and other equipment used in the School, including the laptops and iPads.

Our School does not receive 100% funding from the Government. This is why we ask all parents or guardians for a donation to the Governors Fund.

The donations remain at £30 per child or £45 for a family. This fund is vital and makes a difference to our school and ultimately your child's education.

Please make your donation in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name and class and take it to the school office.
