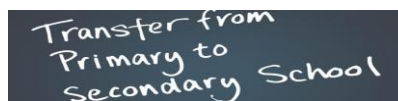
On-line Payments

We are going on-line for all payments this term.

SIMS Pay provides a safe, secure and easy way to pay online for school items such as school meals, trips, events, clubs and other school activities.

SIMS Pay allows you to make online payments to the school whenever and wherever you like, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

All parents will need to sign up to SIMS Parent App by clicking on the link sent to you in the activation email. If you have not received an email inviting you to sign up, then please provide the school office with your email address.

Parents/carers of pupils in year 6 recently received a letter outlining the process for choosing a secondary school for September 2022. Open days and evenings have been taking place in and out of the borough and we know that many of you will be attending these to help inform your choices.

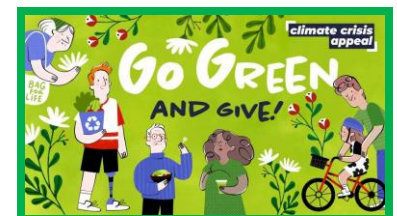
Secondary school applications need to be made online via the **eAdmissions** system. The deadline for making your application is **Friday 15th October**.

Please note the following important points when making your application:

1. Once you have registered successfully, you will receive an e-mail from eAdmissions.
2. It is essential that you do not delete this email as it is necessary for completing the eAdmissions secondary transfer process. E-mails from eAdmissions may go to your junk/spam folder so please check these too.
3. If you have used eAdmissions to make an application in the past (e.g. for another child), login with your email address and password from your previous application. If you cannot remember your username or password click the 'Forgotten username or password?' link.

Parents/carers should complete the applications at home themselves but if you would like the school to assist you with your application then you should make an appointment at the school office to see either Ms Finan or Ms Frankland on:

Halo Hair Code

We are excited to announce that St. Dominic's has adopted 'The Halo Code', the UK's first Black hair code. No Black staff or students should have to change their natural or protective hairstyle in order to thrive at our school.

We hope that the Halo Code will move us one step closer to a world free from discrimination, where all Black members of our community have their identities fully recognised and celebrated.

The Code: *'Our school champions the right of staff and students to embrace all Afro-hairstyles. We acknowledge that Afro-textured hair is an important part of Black staff and students' racial, ethnic, cultural, and religious identities, and requires specific styling for hair health and maintenance.'*

We welcome Afro-textured hair worn in all styles including, but not limited to, afros, locs, twists, braids, cornrows, fades, hair straightened through the application of heat or chemicals, weaves, wigs, headscaves, and wraps.

At this school, we recognise and celebrate our staff and students' identities. We are a community built on an ethos of equality and respect where hair texture and style have no bearing on anyone's ability to succeed.'



Black History Celebration Day and Lunch.

On Thursday 14th October, as part of our Black History celebrations, children are invited to come to school dressed in national costume or the colours of their native flag. Lavena and her catering team will also be preparing a special school dinner of rice and peas, jollof rice, fried chicken, plantain and dumplings for children. Governors Fund

As a Catholic Voluntary Aided School, we are required to contribute 10% towards all costs relating to the maintenance of and improvement to the children's classrooms, all other buildings and the school grounds, including the school gates and fencing to the playground, as well as any IT and other equipment used in the School, including the laptops and iPads.
