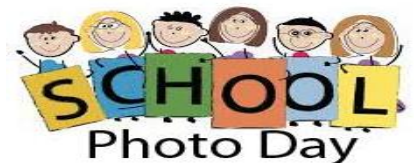
Spare Clothes for Reception Class

Year 3 Swimming Lessons

As part of the Year 3 curriculum children in year 3 will be having compulsory swimming lessons starting Thursday 4th November. Letters will be sent to parents advising them of the arrangements.



Flu Nasal Spray Programme

The children's flu vaccine is offered as a yearly nasal spray to young children to help protect them against flu.

Flu can be a very unpleasant illness for children, with potentially serious complications, including bronchitis and pneumonia. The vaccine is given as a single spray squirted up each nostril. Not only is it needle-free - a big advantage for children - the nasal spray is quick, painless, and works even better than the injected flu vaccine.

The vaccine is absorbed very quickly. It will still work even if, after the vaccination, your child develops a runny nose, sneezes or blows their nose.

Children from Reception class to year 6 have been given a consent form for the vaccination which needs to be returned by **Monday 1st November**. A team from the Hackney Immunisation Service will carry out the vaccinations on **Tuesday 19th November**.

On Tuesday 23rd November a team from NHS Community Dental Services will be in school to apply a fluoride

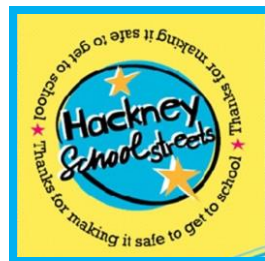
application for the children in Reception and Year 1.

Hackney School Streets

A school Street is where the road(s) outside of a school temporarily becomes a pedestrian and Cycle Zone during school opening and closing times, helping pupils walk and cycle to school safely.

Ballance Road, from the junction with Kenworthy Road to just beyond the school gates, operates as a Pedestrian and Cycle Zone between 8.30am-9.30am and 3pm-4pm, Monday to Friday during school term time only.

If you enter the School Street zone during the operating hours without a valid exemption, you may be subject to a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN).

We have been advised that the cameras will be operational shortly.

Parents should ensure that children arrive at school on time and not use the School Street zone operational times as an excuse to be late.

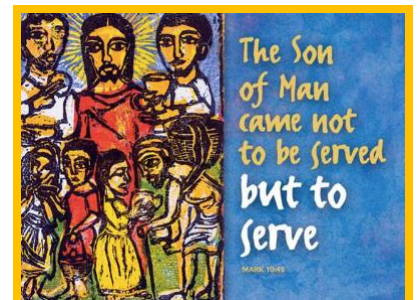
