Secondary school applications need to be made online via the eAdmissions system. The deadline for making your application is Friday 20th October.

Please note the following important points when making your application:

- Once you have registered successfully, you will receive an email from eAdmissions.
- 2. It is essential that you do not delete this email as it is necessary for completing the eAdmissions secondary transfer process. E-mails from eAdmissions may go to your junk/spam folder so please check these too.
- 3. If you have used eAdmissions to make an application in the past (e.g. for another child), login with your email address and password from your previous application. If you cannot remember your username or password click the 'Forgotten username or password?' link

Flu Nasal Spray Programme

The children's flu vaccine is offered as a yearly nasal spray to young children to help protect them against flu. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness for children, with potentially serious complications. including bronchitis and pneumonia. The vaccine is given as a single spray squirted up each nostril. Not only is it needle-free - a big advantage for children - the nasal spray is quick, painless, and works even better than the injected flu vaccine. The vaccine is absorbed very quickly. It will still work even if, after the vaccination, your child develops a runny nose, sneezes or blows their nose. Children from Reception class to year 6 have been given an e-consent link and letter for the vaccination. A team from

the Hackney Immunisation Service will carry out the vaccinations on Tuesday 10th October.



Breakfast Club and After School Clubs.

Breakfast Club is available for Reception-Year 6 and runs from 8am-8:45am and costs £1.00 per day. Children will receive a variety of food choices which include, sausages, beans, scrambled eggs, croissants, bagels, yoghurts and cereals. Please see Miss Mira or the school office for details.

After School club runs from 3:30pm until 5:30pm and costs £10 per day. The club is open to all year groups and offers lots of fun activities and help with homework. Please see Miss Currie or a member of staff in the main office if you have any queries.

Jeans for Genes day

On Friday 22nd September we are asking children and staff to get their jeans on and donate £1 to support children affected by genetic disorders.

There are around 6,000 genetic disorders. It is estimated that one in 25 children are affected by a genetic disorder. 30,000 babies and children are newly diagnosed in the UK each

year. Some genetic disorders are apparent at birth while others are diagnosed at different stages throughout childhood, and sometimes into adolescence.



Governors Fund
