## Secondary Transfer

Parents/carers of pupils in year 6 recently received a booklet outlining the process for choosing a secondary school for September 2024. Open days and evenings have been taking place in and out of the borough and we know that many of you will be attending these to help inform your choices.

Secondary school applications need to be made online via the **eAdmissions** system. **The deadline for making your application is Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October.**

Please note the following important points when making your application:

1. Once you have registered successfully, you will receive an e-mail from eAdmissions.
2. It is essential that you do not delete this email as it is necessary for completing the eAdmissions secondary transfer process. E-mails from eAdmissions may go to your junk/spam folder so please check these too.
3. If you have used eAdmissions to make an application in the past (e.g. for another child), login with your email address and password from your previous application. If you cannot remember your username or password click the 'Forgotten username or password?' link.

Parents/carers should complete the applications at home themselves but if you would like the school to assist you with your application then you

should make an appointment at the school office to see Ms Finan on:

## Are you entitled?

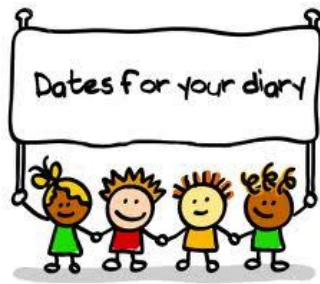
### Free School Meals

Families who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) need to register to ensure they receive all the benefits they are entitled to. Our school will then receive pupil premium funding.

Registering will ensure families receive other benefits they may be entitled to, like food vouchers during school holidays.

It is simple to register and confidential. Parents and carers can apply easily via the Hackney Education website.

### Flu Nasal Spray Programme

The children's flu vaccine is offered as a yearly nasal spray to young children to help protect them against flu. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness for children, with potentially serious complications, including bronchitis and pneumonia. The vaccine is given as a single spray squirted up each nostril. Not only is it needle-free - a big advantage for children - the nasal spray is quick, painless, and works even better than the injected flu vaccine. The vaccine is absorbed very quickly. It will still work even if, after the vaccination, your child develops a runny nose, sneezes or blows their nose. Children from Reception class to year 6 have been given an e-consent link and letter for the vaccination. A team from the Hackney Immunisation Service will carry out the vaccinations on **Tuesday 10th October**.



### CAFOD Brighten Up Day Wednesday 11th October.

Harvest time is nearly upon us again and we are asking you to Brighten Up this Harvest by dressing up as brightly as possible and donating £1.00 to CAFOD.
